Parents Informed Of Pilot's Death

Carlisle, Feb. 17. — Mrs. Eva Kathryn Anglin, 133 West High street, has received official notice from Pan-American Airways that her son, Capt. Samuel C. Anglin, Jr., pilot for the concern, lost his life, August 20, 1943.

His plane was shot down by the Japanese.

Captain Anglin was a graduate of Mechanicsburg High School, received his early training at Wilson Flying School, took courses from Scranton Correspondence School and later from Pan-American Airways. He became a captain at the age of 20 while in Africa.

Captain Anglin is survived by his widow, who resides in the Harrisburg Pike near New Kingston; his mother, a teacher in the Savannah School in Dickinson township, and his father, v
